Methodology

The training will be designed based on **non-formal learning methodology** and according to the needs of participants and partner organisations. It will be learner-centred. The experienced international trainers' team will offer an **active participatory programme** where participants can explore and reflect on the broad variety of non-formal learning methods used. Participants will improve their citizenship competence and cultural awareness and expression through different non-formal learning methods such as

individual reflection, pair and group work, theatre, montage, field visit, open space methodology, etc.



Financial Conditions

All accommodation and food costs will be covered by the project. Travel costs will be reimbursed according to the distance band fixed by the European Commission. You will receive back your travel costs up to the amount stated by the European Commission according to the distance band (see the table below), The reimbursement will be paid ONLY by bank transfer after receiving all the tickets, boarding passes and bills related to the travel.

^{*}GREEN TRAVEL: travel that use low-emissions means of transport for the main part of the travel, such as bus, train or carpooling (instead of plane) receive a bigger amount of reinbursement.

TRAVELLING

The Training Course will take place in **Recoaro Terme**, a town known its mineral spring waters, located in the province of Vicenza, Veneto, in northern Italy.

VERONA "CATULLO" AIRPORT (VRN)

From VERONA airport you have to take the **bus to Verona Porta Nuova** (railway station). The Aerobus service from the airport to the train station runs every 20 minutes, every day of the week. To check the bus connections to the train stations of Verona Porta Nuova: www.aeroportoverona.it/en/aerobus_t2

The ticket costs **6€.**

Once you are in Verona train station, there are trains from **Verona** to **Vicenza** every hour.

VENICE TREVISO "CANOVA" AIRPORT (TSF) OPTION 1 (cheaper!):

From TREVISO airport you have to take the **bus** to the **train station Treviso Centrale**.

Then you will take a **train** from **Treviso Centrale** to **Vicenza** (it comes approx. once an hour). Anyway you can check the site of the Italian railway station, there is an English version, so it will not be difficult for you.

Prices go from 6,35€.

VENICE TREVISO "CANOVA" AIRPORT (TSF) OPTION 2:

From TREVISO airport you can take the **bus** to the **train station** of **Venezia-Mestre**: http://www.atvo.it/index.php?lang=en&area=23&menuid=36&view_pc#

The ticket costs 12€ one way (return ticket 22€ with 10 days validity). You can buy it online, (it costs the same as in the automatic ticket machine), or on board Ryanair flights or in the ticket machine/ticket office in the airport. Then you will take a train from Venezia-Mestre to Vicenza. There are trains from Mestre to Vicenza very often, you can check the site of the Italian railway station: https://www.trenitalia.com/en.html
Prices go from 6,35€ up to 22,00€... The regional trains are cheaper than Frecciarossa, and it takes about 30 minutes more.



VENICE "MARCO-POLO" AIRPORT (VCE)+

From Venice airport you have to take the **bus** to the **train station** of **Venezia**– **Mestre:**

The ticket costs €10 (€ 18 round trip). You can buy it online (you can have a discount but only if you buy more than one ticket), or in the automatic ticket machine/ticket office in the airport.

Then you will take a train from Venezia-Mestre to Vicenza.

There are trains from Mestre to Vicenza very often, you can check the site of the Italian railway station: https://www.trenitalia.com/en.html

Prices go from **6,35€** up to 22,00€... The regional trains are cheaper than Frecciarossa, and it takes about 30 minutes more.



MILANO-BERGAMO "ORIO AL SERIO" AIRPORT (BGY)

+

OPTION 1: Once a day there is a direct **Flixbus** from **Bergamo Airport** to **Vicenza**. **OPTION 2:** take a **Flixbus** to **Verona** and from Verona take a **train** to **Vicenza** (Flixbus stop is very near to the train station). https://global.flixbus.com/

OPTION 3: From Milano-Bergamo airport you have to take the **bus "Orio shuttle"** to **Milano Centrale train Station**. The bus leaves from Arrivals, Platform 2, every half an hour and it takes about 50 minutes to arrive in the Milano Centrale train Station. The ticket costs **10€**. You can check the timetable and buy the ticket online at: http://www.orioshuttle.com/_eng/

There are trains from **Milano** to **Vicenza** every hour, you can check the site of the Italian railway station: https://www.trenitalia.com/en.html
Prices go from **15,95€** up to 42,00€... The regional trains are cheaper than Frecciarossa and it takes about 50 minutes more. •

MILANO "MALPENSA" AIRPORT (MXP)

From Malpensa airport you have to take the Malpensa express train to Milano Centrale train station. The ticket costs 13€ one way (round trip 20€ with 30 days validity). You can check the timetable and buy it on line at: http://www.malpensaexpress.it/en/

choosing "on-line ticket" from "Milano Aeroporto" to "Milano Centrale".

Prices go from **15,95€** up to 42,00€... The regional trains are cheaper than
Frecciarossa and it takes about 50 minutes more.

MILANO "LINATE" AIRPORT (LIN)

Milano Linate you have 2 options to get to Milano Centrale:

OPTION 1 is to take Linate shuttle: https://www.milano-aeroporti.it/linate-shuttle/index.html The ticket will cost you 7,00€.

OPTION 2 is to take a **metro** and go till **San Babila** stop, then you can change and take the red line or you can have a short walk enjoying the street view of Milan and arrive to **Duomo**, then you have to take the yellow line using the same ticket and arrive to **Milano Centrale**.

Prices go from **15,95€** up to 42,00€... The regional trains are cheaper than
Frecciarossa and it takes about 50 minutes more.

Another optionis to take a **Flixbus** to **Verona** and from Verona take a **train** to **Vicenza** (Flixbus stop is very near to the train station). https://global.flixbus.com/

BOLOGNA "MARCONI" AIRPORT (BLQ)

From Bologna airport you have to take **Marconi Express** that, in 7 minutes, will take you to **Bologna Centrale Station**.

Once in Bologna you have to take a train to Vicenza.

There are trains from **Bologna** to **Vicenza** every hour, you can check the site of the Italian railway station: https://www.trenitalia.com/en.html
Prices go from **14,20€** up to 50,00€... The regional trains are cheaper than Frecciarossa and it takes about one hour more.

You can also check **Flixbus** for better options.

once you are in VICENZA

1. GO TO THE BUS STATION

you have to take a bus to **Recoaro**. Walk out the train station and go to the **left** and walk about

150m to reach the bus station.

The bus leaves almost every half hour, and takes less than 1,5 hour to arrive in Recoaro.

2. BUY THE TICKET

either online, at the ticket machine, at the ticket's office or in the shop inside.

To ask for the ticket you can try to ask it in Italian saying "Vorrei un biglietto per Recoaro per favore", or just use English, they usually get it.

3. DEPART

The bus that you are going to take is **Linea 1** to **Valdagno/Recoaro Terme** and will leave from **box 5**.

once you're in RECOARO

Reach the HOTEL TRETTENERO. The hotel is located in

so just walk around 350m (6 minutes according to Google maps!) straight ahead and you will find a passage on the right.
